Job Description

2022 Forest Youth Success (FYS) Adult Crew Leader

The position is under the general supervision of the FYS Program Coordinator. The Adult Crew Leader shall oversee a work crew of up to two teen mentors and four teen crew members. The FYS Adult Crew Leader performs related work as required or assigned. *Note: Additional responsibilities re: COVID-19 risk management may be required per school district policy and direction from Public Health.

Program Description:

The Skamania County Forest Youth Success Program (FYS) is a summer employment program for middle and high school students that started in 2002. The program's sponsors include the United States Forest Service, the Gifford Pinchot National Forest, Washington State University Extension 4-H, and the Stevenson-Carson School District.

Program Objectives:

- Achieve infrastructure and ecosystem management objectives on the south end of the Gifford Pinchot National Forest and nearby communities.
- Provide an employment opportunity to Skamania County youth.
- Teach fundamentals of forest ecology and management to youth participants using classroom, field trips, and work projects.
- Enhance and develop positive life skills to increase employability using Washington State University 4-H Adventures Challenge Curriculum.
- Develop a sense of responsibility for the forest and Skamania County communities. Improve cooperative relationships between community residents and resource management agencies through working relationships and education.

Crew Leader Responsibilities:

Crew Leaders are responsible for leading teen crews in the completion of various task-oriented projects. Projects may include, but are not limited to trail & campground maintenance, various surveys & monitoring, and other tasks assigned by public agencies. Crew Leaders are also responsible for getting crews safely to work sites and back to home base. Crew leaders are accountable for the whereabouts and safety of each member of their crew during work hours. They will be trained to sequence and lead and/or co-lead 4-H portable challenge activities and guide students in personal development initiatives. They will maintain organization of daily paperwork and log sheets, evaluate and document participants behaviors and work habits, and are expected to model a good work ethic.

Program Structure:

The program will begin with mentorship and facilitation training for adult staff on June 22nd, with youth leadership and tool training for Crew Leaders and Mentors beginning June 29th. Youth Crew

Members join their crews for the start of the season on Tuesday, July 5th. Crews consist of one crew leader, two mentors (11th and 12th graders), and four crew members (8th-10th graders). The crews will work from Monday-Thursday in the Gifford Pinchot National Forest working on a variety of projects sponsored by local public agencies. Fridays are designated classroom days to meet the learning objectives of the program.

A variety of 4-H curriculum from the WSU Extension 4-H program is used throughout the program to develop team members' self-awareness, teamwork, and other life skills. Students also complete curriculum that includes forest ecology and management, life skills, and job search skills. The summer ends with a celebratory community brunch and slide show in August.

Requirements:

Must be 21+. Ability to lead and supervise middle- and high-school aged students and willingness to learn how to facilitate 4-H and forestry based curriculum. Knowledge and skills in oral and written communication. Willing to work in diverse weather; dry, hot, rainy. This work requires physical exertion in the field including heavy lifting (up to 50 lbs.), pushing of wheelbarrows, and use of hand tools. Work requires walking on steep, rocky terrain for miles at a time. Travel will be required to schools, work sites and camp sites.

Washington State Governor Jay Inslee's Proclamation 21-14.2 requires all employees of Washington public school districts to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 as a condition of employment unless a documented medical or religious exemption is approved. Assignment: Seasonal/Temporary Employment for approximately 8 weeks beginning June 22nd to the middle of August (approximately August 12th). Exact dates may be adjusted. 40 hours per week

Pay: Starting pay for crew leaders is \$17/hr commensurate with experience.
